

Banco de la República (the Central Bank of Colombia), as per Law 1683 of 28 November 2013, issued a coin to commemorate the bicentenary of *Cundinamarca's* independence proclaimed on 16 July 1813. On the **obverse**, the coin exalts Antonio Nariño's image with the texts "*Bicentenario de la Independencia de Cundinamarca-1813-*" (Bicentenary of Cundinamarca's independence-1813) and "*El Triunfo de las ideas*" (The triumph of ideas), which corresponds to the message used by the governor's office of *Cundinamarca* as the motto for the bicentenary's commemorative events.



The **reverse** shows *Cundinamarca's* current coat of arms, one of the most representative official symbols of this department, including the text "*República de Colombia*" (Republic of Colombia), the face value, and the year of issue.
