1,000-Peso Coin

A loggerhead turtle, a highly migratory marine species, is the image in the obverse (Heads) of the new bimetallic COP\$1000 coin, which will return to the hands of Colombian people when *Banco de la República* (the Central Bank of Colombia) puts it into circulation in the second half of 2012.



500-Peso Coin

A crystal frog, an inhabitant of the Andean foothills (one of the most biologically rich areas in *Colombia*), will be the image in the obverse (heads) of the new COP\$500 bi-metallic coin, which *Banco de la República* (the Central Bank of Colombia) will start circulating as of the second half of 2012.



200-Peso Coin

The scarlet macaw, the *frailejón*, and the spectacled bear are the three representative species of the Colombian biodiversity that will be present in the obverse (heads) of the new COP\$200, COP\$100, and COP\$50 coins, which *Banco de la República* (the Central Bank of Colombia) will start circulating as of the second half of 2012.



100-Peso Coin

The scarlet macaw, the *frailejón*, and the spectacled bear are the three representative species of the Colombian biodiversity that will be present in the obverse (heads) of the new COP\$200, COP\$100, and COP\$50 coins, which *Banco de la República* (the Central Bank of Colombia) will start circulating as of the second half of 2012.



50-Peso Coin

The scarlet macaw, the *frailejón*, and the spectacled bear are the three representative species of the Colombian biodiversity that will be present in the obverse (heads) of the new COP\$200, COP\$100, and COP\$50 coins, which *Banco de la República* (the Central Bank of Colombia) will start circulating as of the second half of 2012.
