Along her career, she has specialized in the design, implementation, and assessment of social programs, and has experience in managing poverty reduction strategies, social safety nets, and targeting schemes.

Ms. Taboada has been a member of the Board of Directors of *Banco de la República* since February 2021. Previously, she held the position as *Subdirectora General para la Superación de la Pobreza* (Deputy Director General for Poverty Eradication) at the *Departamento Administrativo para la Prosperidad Social* (Administrative Department for Social Prosperity). She was an assessment and economics specialist, senior assessment associate, and consultant for the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) at the Office for Strategic Planning and Development Effectiveness.

She was also a consultant for the World Bank and has supported research teams at IPA, the IDB, and *Universidad de los Andes*.
